## Admission Criteria

To be considered for admission into the program, students must meet the following criteria:

Complete university admission requiremetotistic submission of official transcripts from all colleges/unversities attended. Have a minimum cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 2.5 for all college work(including transfer work and excelling developmental courses) and be in good cademicstanding. Score a minimum of 60% on the ATI TEAS exam. LPNs must provide proof of an active, unencumbered LPN license to practice in Arkansas tobe eligible for the LPN-DN track.

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NOTE: Science ourses takemore than 5 years pior to entering the pogram will be evaluated on an individual basiby the Pogram Director. See the CHEHS Nursing Advising Coordinator from more information and to request a science course valuation.

NOTE: The Arkarsas Sate Board of Nursing requires criminabackground checks in accordance with the NURSE PRACTICE ACT to be performed for students in nursing pograms. The UAS College of Health Education and Huma Sciences ADN Nursing Program as a hird-party vendor to conducte background checks.
